All members should carry a compass, smart-phone or GPS, and be conversant in its use. Members are recommended to have a mobile telephone in their possession. Members will be expected to show they are properly equipped for flights and abide by the risk assessment.	5	1	5	5	Monitor

New members must show an understanding of how to study weather forecasts to appreciate how and when the wind is likely to affect the floodwater. The way in which the floodwater moves onto and off the Ouse Washes will be explained to new members.	5	1	5	10	Monitor

Carry and use a wading stick and know your route, especially when returning from a flight after dark. New members will be made aware that the floodwaters will cover up river channels, dykes and deep holes or ponds all of which present a risk of drowning.	3	1	3	3	Monitor
Avoid electric fences, which should carry warning signs. Take care when crossing barbed wire, especially in flood conditions. Where possible walk to and use a gate. Keep clear of stored farm machinery.	3	1	3	3	Monitor
Members using Boat should ensure the vessel is fit for purpose and they are competent to operate them. Life jackets must be worn at all times in a boat. A means of communication Mobile Phone and or Flares should be carried while using boats	5	1	5	10	Monitor

The access track can become flooded and or very muddy and slippery in the wet and frosty winter months, access by vehicle in these times must be only done in a vehicle with suitable tyres and preferrable 4-wheel drive.
